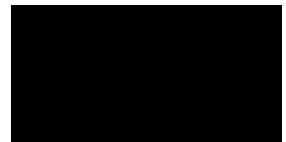

LONDON: The public inquiry into the death of Alexander Litvinenko continues. On Monday, evidence on Mr Litvinenko's corporate security and investigations work will be heard. Witnesses Garym Evans, Keith Hunder, John Holmes and Clifford Knuckey will appear. On Tuesday, evidence on suspects Andrei Lugovoi and Dmitri Kovtun will be heard. Witnesses Detective Inspector Craig Mascall, Nigel Moughton, Paul Fitzgerald will appear. On Wednesday and Thursday, evidence covering the period October 16-18 2006, when Lugovoi and Kovtun are thought to have attempted poisoning Mr Litvinenko for the first time. Witnesses Detective Inspector Craig Mascall, Detective Constable Spencer Scott, Goran Krgo, Tim Reilly and Giuliana Rondoni will appear. The Royal Courts of Justice, The Strand, London, WC2A 2LL.

LONDON: Trial of man accused of arming himself with weapons for an alleged terror plot on British soldiers. Brusthom Ziamani, 29, is charged with preparing an act of terrorism on or before August 20 this year. The details of the charge state that Ziamani researched locations of military bases and how to achieve "Jannah" or paradise. He is also alleged to have encouraged others to engage in Jihad and written a letter expressing his intention to commit a terrorist act on military or government personnel. The charge goes on to state that he made peace with an ex-girlfriend and armed himself with a knife and a hammer. Ziamani, of Warner Road, Camberwell, south east London, pleaded not guilty on December 4. The Old Bailey, 32 Old Bailey, London, EC4M 7EH.

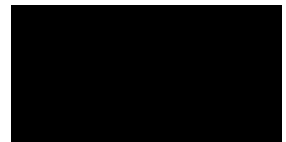

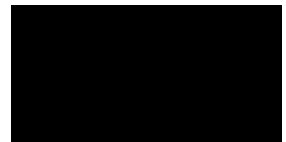

1000 LONDON: Polly Chowdhury may give evidence in her trial for the murder of daughter Ayesha. Old Bailey.

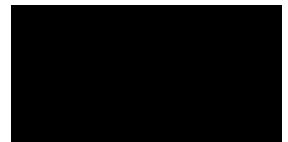
